Neighbourhood Policing Team annual update, Insp. Karen Cooke - Neighbourhood Policing Team Deputy Commander.

Incident Demand

There has been a 3% reduction in demand in the last 12 months with an average of 37 calls for service per day.

All Crime

There has been a 3% overall decrease in crime in the last 12 months of 5,059 from 5,192.

Burglary residential – 4% increase in last 12 months (105 from 101) – crime reclassification now includes shed, garage breaks in this figure

Criminal damage – Reduction in the past three years, this year reduced by 11%, 472 from 529

Theft from motor vehicle – 24% reduction in last 12 months - 78 from 102.

Theft of motor vehicle – increase of 26% - 125 from 99

Sexual offences – Reduction of 30% - 38 from 54

Less serious violence with injury – 17% reduction - 628 from 758

Outcomes

This year outcomes sit at 16% for overall crime. Last year this figure was 12%

ASB

Last three years has seen a reduction in ASB, this year a further 37% reduction, from 726 from 1,148

Annual Overview

The local policing team has stabilised considerably with regard to staffing with officers becoming more experienced (less student officers than 12 months ago).

This is reflected in overall demand and overall reported crime has slightly decreased by 3% in the last 12 months.

Moorlands positive outcome rate has also improved from 12% last year to 16% currently.

There has been an increase in theft of motor vehicle, mainly in the last 6 months of this year. This is now reducing due to the arrest and remand of key individuals responsible for bulk of offences

Moorlands also has its own Harm Reduction Hub, staffed with experienced officers who work closely with partners to manage vulnerability. This includes domestic abuse, Child exploitation and mental health. This team work hand in glove with response and neighbourhood officers to address all strands of vulnerability and safeguarding.
