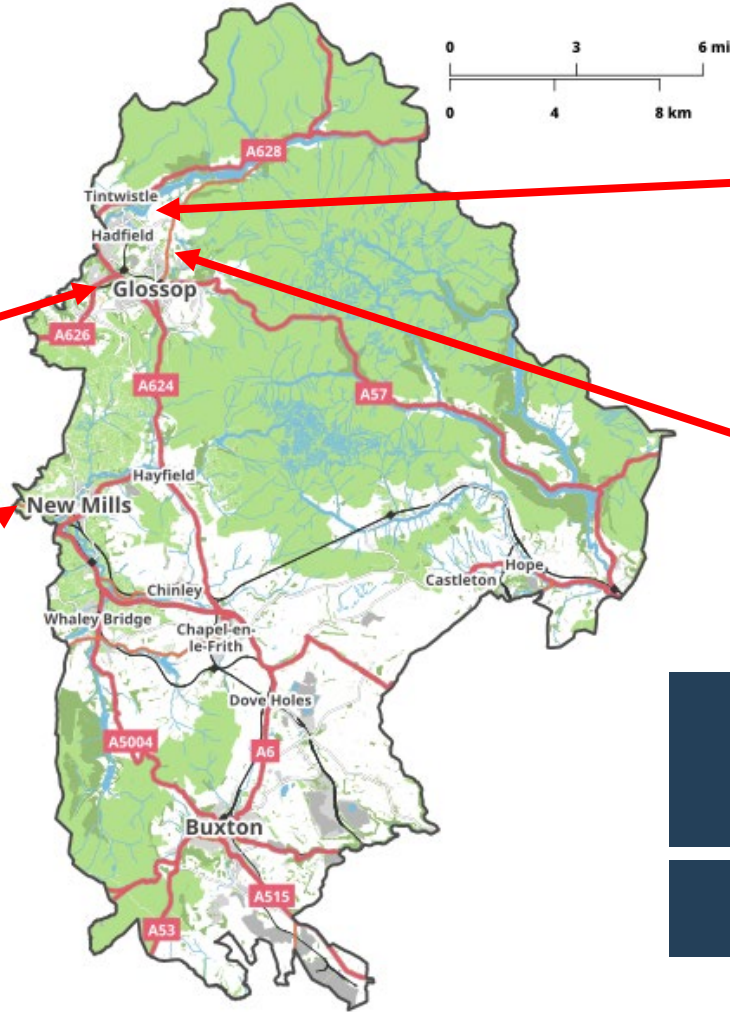

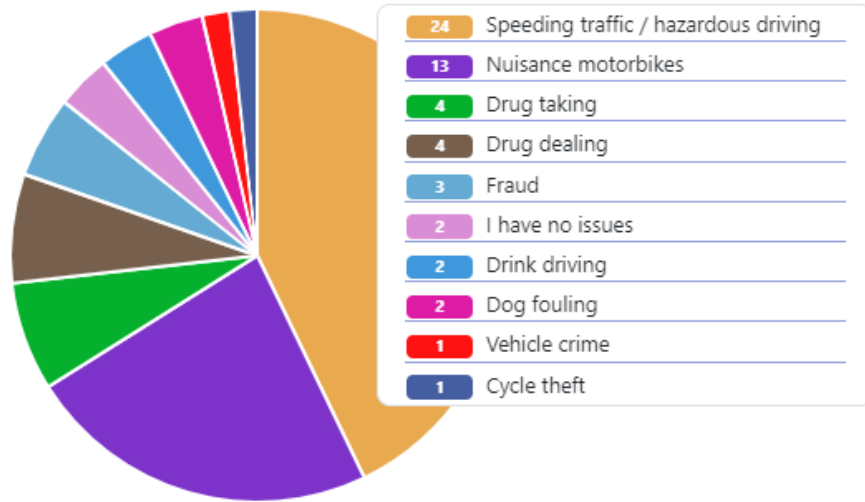

A two-way messaging interface system that allows Derbyshire police to keep the public up to date on day-to-day on-goings. Through this service we can also ask members of the public to complete surveys to determine issues in certain areas and therefore; concentrate policing resources appropriately.

Issues Removed



In October 2024, residents were asked which issues they feel had been resolved in The High Peak.

6,146 people in the High Peak are signed up for Derbyshire Alert.

These individuals have received a total of 432 Derbyshire Alert messages from High Peak SNT.

In the last six months, a total of 647 surveys have been completed with members of the High Peak public.

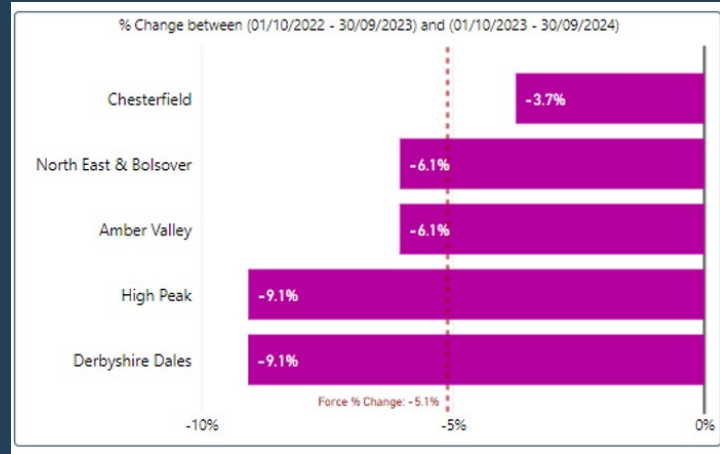
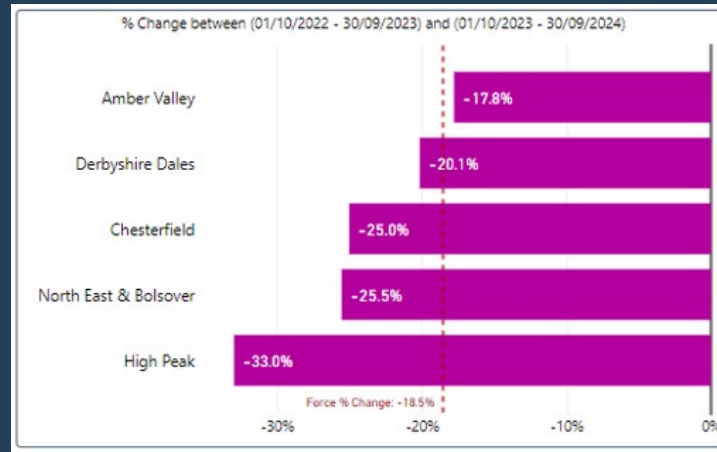

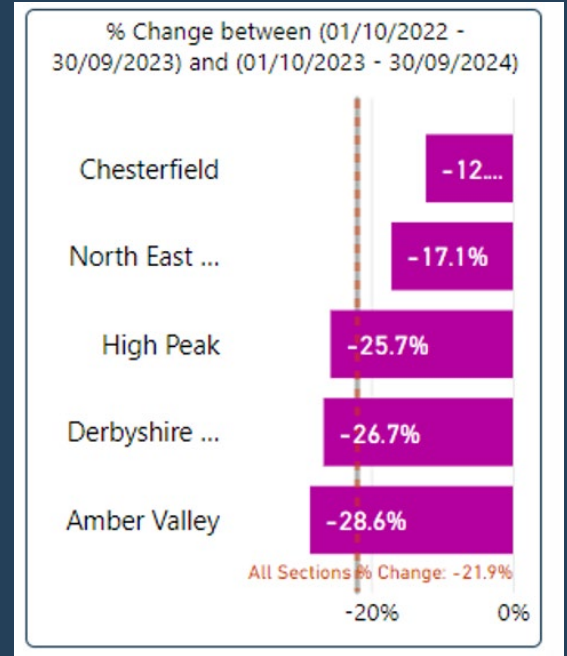


Crime Focus
